

Next is a note from **Don Gray**: “Duke, On 16 December 2019 a group of ‘71ers met at National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) Kennedy Space Center (KSC) Visitor Center NASA to tour the facility and to meet with KSC Director and classmate, **Bob Cabana**. Classmates attending were Becky and **Tom Bowman**, Lori and **Don Gray**, Debbie and **Jim Gosma**, Erica and **Bill Matz**, Jane and **John Reitz** and Mary and **Jeff Steelman**.”

“We received a behind the scenes tour of the enormous Vehicle Assembly Building (VAB) for payload and rocket assembly. Next, we saw an empty, missile crawler-transporter relocating at one mph from the VAB to the launch pads. It can carry a 13-million-pound rocket. We then had the opportunity to inspect a second behemoth transporter built in 1965 that was receiving routine maintenance. It weighs 6.6 million pounds. We had access to the Operations and Checkout (O&C) Building. We saw firsthand the Artemis capsules that are destined to land the first woman and next man on the Moon by 2024.

“We then traveled to the launch pads for Space X and Boeing’s Starliner. We returned to the NASA KSC Visitor Center where we met Bob Cabana, a veteran of four Space Shuttle flights. Bob approved our visit and gave us a personal tour of the Space Shuttle Atlantis® inside the Visitor Center.

“The tour was fantastic. We all enjoyed seeing the details that make space flight possible. A special thanks to Bill Matz, Don Gray and Bob Cabana for making the visit possible. Thanks, Don.” Wow, sounds like a superb tour! I look forward to touring KSC with Bob, date TBD!”

Here's some exciting news for USNA '71: **COL Robert Cabana, USMC (Ret)**, was selected as a U.S. Naval Academy Alumni Association Distinguished Graduate (DGA) Award

recipient. As noted in the above note, Bob is currently serving as the Director of NASA's John F. Kennedy Space Center. Bob is a former NASA astronaut and a veteran of four Space Shuttle flights. He served as a Naval Aviator in the United States Marine Corps for many years prior to his entry into the space program. This is the third year in a row that USNA AA has chosen a DGA from our Great Class of 1971. Bob follows in the footsteps of Admiral **Tim Keating**, USN (Ret.) - 2018 and COL **Walt Havenstein**, USMC, (Ret.) - 2019.
